At approximately 1000 hours, 04042005, I (Detective Van Unen) received a telephone call a man identifying himself as 'Karbino' (Kuel.) Karbino said he heard that Abuk (Deng) was at the doctor for an abortion at the time of this call. Karbino wanted to know how he could stop it. I told him there was nothing he or we could do to stop it. He asked if he should get a lawyer to stop the abortion. I essentially told him I could not provide him with guidance. Karbino said he heard Abuk (and her brother/guardian) were at the Olathe Medical Center (OMC.) Karbino also remarked that the 911 dispatcher told him something about getting a lawyer.

I responded to the OMC and contacted Nursing Supervisor Cole Hargett. Mr. Hargett checked all available files and records and determined Abuk was not at OMC.

I contacted Communications Officer Melissa Brown at the Olathe Police Dispatch. Off. Brown advised she took a 911 call this morning from a man who identified himself as Karbino Kuel asked about stopping an abortion. The man told Off. Brown the family of his girlfriend claimed she was 12 years old, but he said she was 16 years old. I recovered a recording of this call and placed it into evidence under property slip #80588.

I went to Abuk's apartment and spoke with her brother/guardian, Rual Ayat. Rual said Abuk had an appointment at the Johnson County Mental Health Office for an abortion at 1400 hours today. For verification of the location, I had Rual write the address down on a piece of paper. He wrote '1125 W. Spruce,' which was the address for Johnson County Mental Health. (I noted that Rual's understanding of the purpose of the appointment may have been in error, however due to the language barrier, I did not attempt to clarify it.)

I contacted Rual at the Johnson County Mental Health Office at about 1400 hours, 04042005. An Arabic interpreter was there to assist the mental health Staff. I also spoke with a Mental Health supervisor and collectively, we determined Rual thought the appointment was for an abortion. The interpreter assisted in helping Rual understand what his/Abuk's appointment was for counselling, not an abortion. I made sure that Rual understood to contact me prior to the abortion, if he actually set one up.

On 04132005 at 0830 hours, I (Detective Van Unen) went to Planned Parenthood, 4401 W. 109th Street, Suite 100, Overland Park, KS for a scheduled abortion for Abuk Deng.

I met with Abuk's brother, Rual D. Ayat and Abuk in the waiting room. While waiting, I was contacted by Karice Lewis, the Administrative Manager for Planned Parenthood. Ms. Lewis advised me that Abuk's pregnancy was more advanced than originally thought. She said Abuk was 13.3 weeks along and the abortion would be a two day process. She said we could return at 1000 hours, 04142005.

Detective Mike Ross and I arrived at Planned Parenthood at 1000 hours, 04142005. The abortion was conducted by Dr. Oris Moore and witnessed by myself and Det. Ross. Dr. Moore packaged the fetal tissue in a specimen container and I recovered it as evidence on property slip #80585. Det. Ross recovered a known DNA sample (saliva) from Abuk. We transported the sample and specimen to the Johnson County Crime lab and submitted them, in addition to the previously recovered DNA sample from Karbino Kuel-Mdut, to the crime lab for analysis.

On 04192005, I (Detective Van Unen) called the Sudanese Embassy in Washington D.C. ((202) 338-8565)) and spoke with a Sudanese clerk. I asked her hypothetically how a juvenile refugee or her family from the Sudan might benefit by changing the age of the juvenile from 16 years old 12 years old. Specifically, if the juvenile was accompanied by her brother (or cousin) as her legal guardian, would the changing her age to be younger have any benefit. The clerk stated generally there would be no benefit in changing the age of the child for the purpose of immigrating to Egypt or the United States. However, she noted different tribes in the Sudan may have different cultures and traditions which may have an affect on the child's age, but because of the vast numbers of different tribes, she could not provide any examples.
